The Regional Adviser (International) is a key role which provides a focus for specialist advice and support relating to international and global events and activities.

Responsible to

Appointment requirements

- Understand and accept The Scout Association's policies
- Satisfactory PVG clearance
- Completion of the relevant training within three years of appointment

Main Responsibilities

- To provide the Region with effective support in order to enable more young people to experience International Scouting in its broadest sense
- To manage work in the International/Global area
- To provide a focus for specialist advice and support in relation to the International/Global area, to other members of the Regional Team and those in the Region and its Districts
- To proactively promote and develop the International/Global area within the Region
- To provide assistance and guidance to leaders in all areas of the International/Global agenda
- To provide support and advice in relation to grants/funds that may be available for Overseas expeditions, camps and trips

Core Tasks

- Contribute to the achievement of the aim and objectives set for the appointment by the Regional Commissioner, Regional Team and Regional Executive
- Working with other Regional colleagues, help promote the growth of the Movement in line with priorities determined by the Regional Executive
- Contribute as a member of the Regional Team
- Take responsibility for agreed areas of work within the Regional Team and Executive, as decided with the Regional Commissioner. These duties may include liaison with other Advisers or Commissioners, work on projects or initiatives; research; agreed special work; or work in one or more Sections; liaison with other organisations. Such duties are to be reviewed periodically with the Regional Commissioner.
- Work to develop and implement The Scout Association's policies and strategy and to promote a holistic, '6 –25' approach to the Programme
- Provide leadership and be a 'face for Region' to the Movement at large
- Monitor and evaluate the wider International/Global area including developing and promoting activities in the youth programme of all Sections in the Global and equivalent zones and to advise the Regional Team on possible further development
- Provide active advice, support and encouragement to appropriate Commissioners, Advisers and Co-ordinators in the Region and its Districts and to identify and spread good practice
- Communicate effectively with the relevant UK International Commissioner at National Headquarters and the Scottish Headquarters Adviser (International)
- Advise Regional committees and working groups on International matters
- Participate in the Annual General Meeting of the Region

Person Specification

Skills required

- Able to communicate clearly
- Able to work well in meetings
- Able to address public meetings
- Able to provide positive management in relation to the activity area
- Able to develop effective relationships
- Able to work well as a member of a team
- Able to motivate others

Knowledge and experience required

- An appreciation of The Scout Association's aim, method and youth programme
- A thorough working knowledge of some aspects of International Scouting
- A thorough grounding in the principles and practice of the International/Global area

- Experience of attending one or more large International Scout events
- Experience of taking Scouts on International trips or visits
- An understanding of and commitment to the training obligations of the appointment

Qualities required

- A commitment to the philosophy of providing International/Global activities for young people safely
- An ability to balance their enthusiasm for the particular area with the aspirations and abilities of young people
- Have the time available to do the work
- Ability to meet deadlines
- An appreciation of the requirement to communicate with others as part of a two way process
- Be in a position to travel to meetings as required
